Welcome to the October edition of the Inverurie Academy Newsletter for 2017-18.

A huge amount of activity and industry has been packed into our first eight weeks of this new session; students settling in to Broad General Education lessons in S1 – S3, senior students making progress in certificate classes on their journey to success in national qualifications, wider curricular groups and clubs resuming activities in Duke of Edinburgh, Young Enterprise, Rock Challenge, Orchestra and Football to name but a few.

Social Media Event – Monday, 2 October 2017 – 6.30 pm

Continuing our programme of Community Learning, around 40 parents attended a workshop run by *Girling Hughes* on Online Presence and Social Media. This was a hard-hitting event and yet those who attended left with a series of practical steps to protect their own online data and ways to support young people with their own online presence.

Quality Improvement Visit – Tuesday, 3 October 2017 – Thursday, 5 October 2017

On Tuesday, Inverurie Academy hosted a team of five Aberdeenshire colleagues to support the school in carrying out a Quality Improvement Visit. This visit consisted of classroom observations, discussions with the extended leadership of the school and also meeting with groups of students, parents, staff and support staff. At the end of the visit, Mrs Cruickshanks (Quality Improvement Officer) explained that she felt that there was a really positive atmosphere within the school and that Inverurie Academy was on a real journey of improvement. We are really grateful for the advice and feedback received from this team.

Tree of Knowledge & Callum Smith – Wednesday 4 & Thursday, 5 October 2017

Tree of Knowledge are regular visitors to Inverurie Academy, providing stimulating workshops to students to support them in achieving their potential. During this part of the session, S5 and S6 students were the recipients of this support.

On Wednesday, S5 students were joined by former Inverurie Academy student Callum Smith. Callum has competed at the 2011 and 2013 World Championships and made his Olympic debut in Sochi in 2014. Callum spoke with groups of students about the importance of aiming high, planning and preparation.



Twinning Visit – Thursday, 5 October 2017

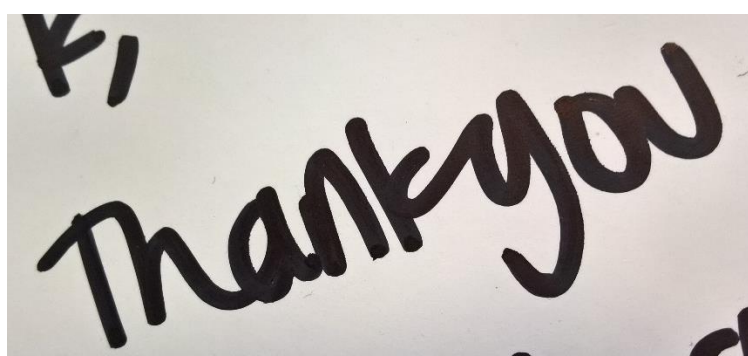

Mr Prosser then organised a series of activities for our French visitors and students currently studying languages at Inverurie Academy.

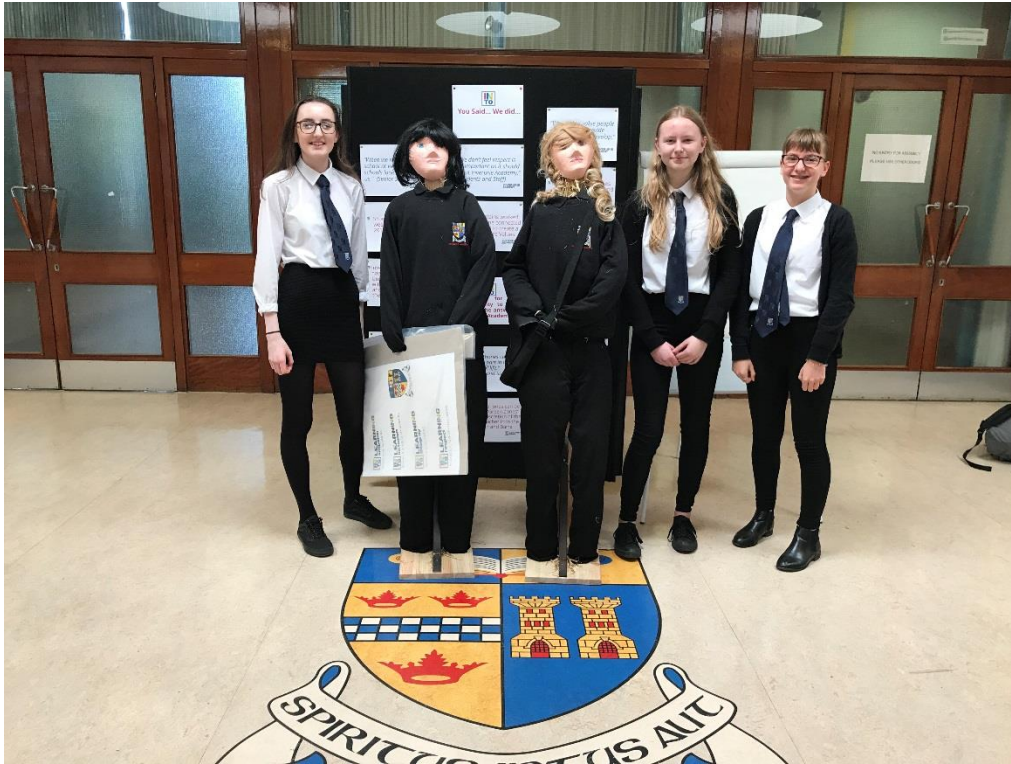

- 1. The Telephone Information Line** number is **0370 054 4999**. You will be asked for the school PIN number. It is **021060**. Once the PIN number is entered, simply follow the instructions (you need a push pad telephone to do so). During bad weather information will be updated each evening at about 6.00pm, or as appropriate.
- 2. The Website** is <https://online.aberdeenshire.gov.uk/Apps/Schools-closures/>. The website is easy to use and the information will be updated at regular intervals as appropriate.
- 3. Local Radio Stations** will announce closures. The website is linked to local radio stations and when the school updates a message on the site it is automatically e-mailed to them.

If you are bringing pupils to school by car you must not bring your car into school either at the Jackson Street entrance or at the West Church entrance.
