COVID-19 Latest

Thank you for your continued support in efforts to mitigate risk in and around Inverurie Academy. This has been a challenging term with infection rates rising nationally, although there are signs of a recent reduction in the past few weeks.

We continue to look for support of the local community in the following ways...

- Maintaining good hand hygiene.
- Wearing face coverings (in school, and when using school transport).
- Following the one-way system that is in place.
- Carrying out lateral flow testing regularly. (Supplies are readily available from the school office young people can collect these as/when needed. Please remember to record the result.)
- The advice we have is that staff and secondary students should be encouraged to continue testing during the holiday period in line with national public health guidance. Please ensure that students take a test on Sunday 31st October before returning to school on 1st November.

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Recovery Plans for Inverurie Academy

For us, recovery doesn't mean reducing our expectations, lowering our ambitions or 'taking it easy' as a school community. Instead it means thinking carefully about how we achieve our ambitions, planning to take full advantage of opportunities, and targeting support where it is needed.

- · We will further invest by having a number of staff complete the 'Train the Trainer' course to deliver the Mindset programme in house for future year




- Scaffold positive mindset for S2 students · Have a positive impact on behaviour and poor decision making, leading to a reduction of demerits and exclusions

- Introduction of a virtual Parent Evening platform to allow video-conferencing to replace in-person Extending our use of Microsoft Teams for Parent Council Meetings.




Plan 2021-22 Good at Learning, Good at Life

Our staff team are engaging with Pivotal Education to embark on a programme introducing restorative practice to the school. This commences in November 2021.

- The Learning & Teaching Project Group will be focusing on differentiation.
- The Inver Merit initiative will continue on ten occasions during the year, S1-S6 students will receive a virtual merit award via email to parents/carers with these merits contributing to a consistent effort merit award in June.
- Registration has recommenced with a focus on wellbeing tasks are provided by the Pastoral Team.







Following careful consideration of the Scottish Government guidelines (https://www.gov.scot/publications/coronavirus-covid-19-guidance-on-reducing-the-risks-inschools/) a decision was made to restart wider-curricular activities at Inverurie Academy. 

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Active Travel Route Survey


The following Active Travel Route survey is a chance for students, staff and the local community to get involved in having a say on possible travel routes linking Inverurie, Kemnay and Kintore.

This session sees a welcome return to DofE activities for the large number of participants here at Inverurie. Seven bronze groups comprising of 40 pupils took to the slopes of Bennachie on their qualifying expedition. Pupils planned and followed their own routes over two days walking, whilst also carrying out activities for their aim. Group aims included recoding wildlife sightings and creating a vlog of expedition advice. The pupils were delighted to be getting back out in the countryside and for many this was the last section in completing their bronze award. Comments ranged from: "It was better than I was expecting" to "It was so good!" and "I enjoyed doing something different to my usual weekend!".

The pupils were fantastic representatives of Inverurie Academy as they rose to the challenge and positively interacted with the public. As a result, all seven groups passed the expedition section!

Moving forward, we plan to have more bronze and silver expeditions in the spring. For now though, we will focus on fundraising, training and supporting participants to complete their volunteering, physical and skill section.







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Education Scotland Visit

In September, Scottish Government announced the resumption of activity by Education Scotland. At Inverurie Academy, we received an inspection report in March 2020 which indicated that a further visit would take place to check on the improvement that was evidently in progress.

This visit has frustratingly been delayed due to COVID-19 but we are pleased to confirm that this visit will take place on 22nd and 23rd November. We are looking forward to sharing both the positive story of the school and also our reflections on both impact and recovery following the COVID-19 pandemic.

The visit will include some focus groups with parents/carers, staff and students and we will receive an update from Education Scotland after this visit. This update will be shared with our school community.



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SAMH & Attendance

Inverurie Academy have been allocated a practitioner from SAMH (the Scottish mental health charity) who will join us 2 days a week after the October Holidays. Beth Rose will be working with young people on a 1:1 basis as part of a pilot in two Aberdeenshire schools. Developed in 2020 'Time for Me' is a 6 session life skills course, based on the principles of CBT (Cognitive Behavioural Therapy), for young people aged 11 – 18 years, who are experiencing anxiety, low mood and anger. Referrals are made via the Pupil Support Team and young people must meet certain criteria. Beth will be working with us for one year and spend next term getting to know staff, all our young people and parent/carers by offering advice sessions.



Marie Maclean joins Moreen Laurenson as jobshare Attendance Officer next term, further supporting our drive to improve pupil attendance. Understandably, attendance has been impacted by COVID but to continue our improvement journey, it is essential young people are supported to attend school on a daily basis as it is clearly proven that young people with good attendance go on to achieve well. Thank you to all parent/carers for notifying the school office promptly regarding pupil absence (by 8.30am at latest) – this can be done via the school phone number (Option 1) or via the 'Contact Us' form on the website. Attendance letters will be issued next term for those young people whose attendance over Term 1 has given us cause for concern.

Communication

Whether in normal times or less normal times, it is great to have regular contact from our parents/carers.

However, a plea for understanding... It would be great if you could remember that contact made to school by phone/email/website Contact Us form cannot always necessitate an immediate response. With increasing amounts of digital contact, the workload associated with this has increased exponentially. **As you can understand, the priority of our staff is first and foremost, face-to-face learning and teaching and learner wellbeing**.

When you liaise with a member of the Office staff, Pupil Support Team (Principal Teachers of Guidance/Additional Support for Learning) or the Senior Leadership Team, it may be your communication requires information gathering dependent on the availability of other staff. Please be understanding and reassured that we have to prioritise issues of the most urgent nature in the first instance.
