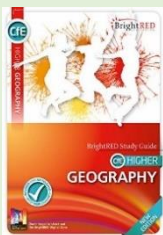
There are seven types of question used in the two question papers in Higher Geography, namely:

A Describe . . . B Explain . . . C Analyse . . . D Evaluate . . . E Account for . . . F Discuss . . . G To What Extent.....

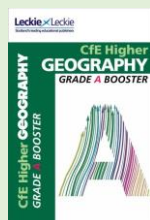
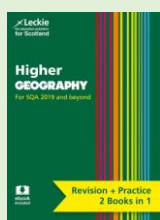
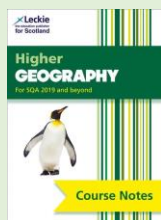
Look in the SQA marking schemes (through the above link) to read more about what these mean. This is a very important part of succeeding at Higher Geography- understanding what a question is asking of you.

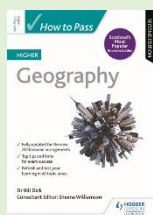
